

Corporate Challenge – Terms and Conditions

By registering to take part in the Grace Kelly Childhood Cancer Trust Corporate Challenge, participants agree to the following Terms and Conditions.

1. Eligibility and Participation

1.1 The Corporate Challenge is open to businesses and organisations that have registered with Grace Kelly Childhood Cancer Trust.

1.2 Participation is subject to acceptance by Grace Kelly Childhood Cancer Trust.

1.3 Each participating business is responsible for ensuring all team members are aware of and comply with these Terms and Conditions.

2. Charity Seed Funding (£50)

2.1 Each participating business will be provided with £50 seed funding by Grace Kelly Childhood Cancer Trust to support their fundraising activity.

2.2 The £50 seed funding must be paid into a bank account in the name of the participating business.

2.3 Under no circumstances will the £50 seed funding be paid into a personal or individual bank account.

2.4 The participating business is responsible for ensuring the seed funding is used solely for the purposes of the Corporate Challenge.

3. Fundraising Requirement

3.1 Each participating business must raise a minimum of £250 in total fundraising income.

3.2 The minimum fundraising total of £250 must be received by 9:00am on Saturday 20th June 2026.

3.3 Failure to reach the minimum fundraising requirement may result in disqualification from the Corporate Challenge and/or awards.

3.4 If a participant chooses to drop out of the challenge the £50 will need to be reimbursed to the charity.

4. Fundraising Totals and Awards

4.1 The fundraising total used for award consideration will be the amount raised by 9:00am on Saturday 20th June.

4.2 This total may include:

Any and all funds raised on the participant's online fundraising page up until 9:00am on Saturday 20th June; and

BACS or cash payments received by Grace Kelly Childhood Cancer Trust by 4:00pm on Thursday 18th June.

4.3 Any funds received after the times stated above will not be included in award calculations but will still be gratefully accepted by the charity.

4.4 Gift Aid is not included in the total amount raised for the purposes of the Corporate Challenge or awards.

5. Fundraising Activities

5.1 All fundraising activities must be conducted in a moral, ethical and lawful manner.

5.2 Fundraising activities must not involve gambling, including but not limited to betting, lotteries, raffles or games of chance that require a licence or fall outside of legal fundraising guidelines.

5.3 Grace Kelly Childhood Cancer Trust reserves the right to request details of any fundraising activity and to prohibit or stop activities that are deemed inappropriate, unsafe or inconsistent with the charity's values.

6. Use of Funds

6.1 All funds raised must be paid directly to Grace Kelly Childhood Cancer Trust and used to support its charitable objectives.

6.2 Participants must not deduct expenses from funds raised unless expressly agreed in advance by the charity.

7. Promotion and Publicity

7.1 By taking part, participants agree that Grace Kelly Childhood Cancer Trust may use the business name, logo, photographs and fundraising activity details for promotional and publicity purposes.

7.2 Any publicity must accurately represent the charity and the nature of the Corporate Challenge.

8. Awards and Judging

8.1 Awards will be presented at the Grace Kelly Childhood Cancer Trust 10th Anniversary Ball.

8.2 Award decisions are made at the sole discretion of Grace Kelly Childhood Cancer Trust and are final.

8.3 Meeting the minimum fundraising requirement does not guarantee an award.

9. General

9.1 Grace Kelly Childhood Cancer Trust reserves the right to amend these Terms and Conditions at any time.

9.2 The charity reserves the right to withdraw a participant from the Corporate Challenge if these Terms and Conditions are breached.

9.3 Participation in the Corporate Challenge implies full acceptance of these Terms and Conditions.
